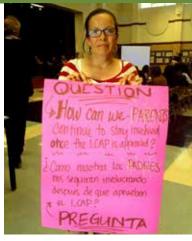

- Community engagement/input sessions: Seven community stakeholder meetings, two meetings with the **Academic Subcommittee (composed** of teachers), four PAC and DELAC meetings (open to the public).

PARENT ADVISORY COUNCIL & DISTRICT ENGLISH LEARNER **ADVISORY COUNCIL**

- Number of members: 37 on PAC, 55 on DELAC
- Representation: Parents and guardians of primary and secondary school students from each high school attendance area, or "family." Community groups also invited to appoint representatives to the PAC.
- How committees were formed: Continuation of pre-existing DELAC. PAC members were nominated school families, community groups, and stakeholder organizations.
- PAC and DELAC received LCAP for review on: March 4, 2014. Committees received and gave feedback on subsequent drafts, released April 25, 2014, and May 5, 2014.

³ Because the early methodology used to count foster youth students was inaccurate, the California Department of Education has determined that foster youth were significantly undercounted in 2013-14 and has worked with the California Department of Social Services to determine a more effective methodology for gathering a complete foster youth data set. These data have been made available to school districts and are being prepared for public release.
