



## **The Education Trust–West Fall K-12 Parent Poll: Bay Area Results**

Global Strategy Group partnered with The Education Trust–West to conduct an online (desktop and mobile) [survey](#) among 800 parents of children in California public schools from October 1<sup>st</sup> - 7<sup>th</sup>, 2020. Below are some results from our sample of 169 parents from the Bay Area.

- 65% of parents are satisfied with their school's approach to addressing and teaching about racism
- 81% of parents feel it is important for schools to hire and retain educators of color
- 73% of parents support Proposition 16
- 82% of parents support Proposition 15
- 99% of parents are in support of the federal government investing more public funds to help schools during the pandemic
- 40% of parents rate their child's distance learning as successful so far this fall
- 78% of parents report their own stress is higher than usual
- 72% of parents report their child's stress is higher than usual

Below are some results from our sample of 209 parents from Los Angeles County.

- 52% of parents report that their child’s school talks about issues of racial injustice, anti-racist practices, and inclusivity
- 62% of parents are satisfied with their school’s approach to addressing and teaching about racism
- 81% of parents feel it is important for schools to hire and retain educators of color
- 67% of parents support proposition 16
- 78% of parents support proposition 15
- 92% of parents are in support of the federal government investing more public funds to help schools during the pandemic
- 31% of parents rate their child’s distance learning as successful so far this fall
- 82% of parents report their own stress is higher than usual
- 63% of parents report their child’s stress is higher than usual
